Wheelchair Basketball Canada 3v3 Festival Hosting Recommendations

As you aim to develop your players' skills and abilities, here are some things to keep in mind when you are hosting an event:

1) Scheduling:

Allow time for bathroom and meal breaks throughout the day, as well as social time while maximizing the time spent on court. Try to make sure hotels are close by, and food is available or brought in (either by organizers or the athletes).

2) Coaching:

Make sure players are getting plenty of repetition of key skills in a stage and age appropriate manner. Scrimmages in the Train to Train stage and lower should be 3 on 3 or some variation. This gives athletes lots of touches on the ball and involvement in the play. Skills Competitions, modified games, mixing up the teams are all things that can make skill development fun.

3) Partnerships:

Referee or Classifiers can be trained in conjunction with a jamboree event, or it can be an opportunity to evaluate chair set up and sizing needs.

4) Recommendations/Stage Appropriate games:
